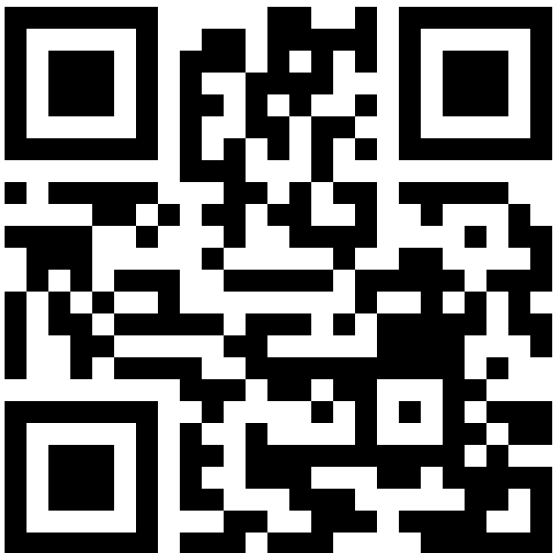
About the speakers
